At the **Department of History's** Chair of Early Modern History, at the University of Greifswald's Faculty of Arts and Humanities, there is a position which is **expected to be available from 1 April 2024**, subject to budgetary regulations, for a part-time (50%)

Teaching and Research Assistant (Doctoral Fellow).

The fixed-term contract is for a **period of three years**. Payment will be made according to pay group 13 *TV-L Wissenschaft* if the personal and pay group qualifications are met.

Job Description:

- Participation in academic research and teaching activities in the field of early modern history
- Participation in supervising and examining students
- The position serves to qualify for a doctorate; it is assigned tasks that are conducive to the preparation of a doctorate

Job Specification:

- Advanced university degree in history (Staatsexamen, master's or equivalent)
- Specialisation in the field of early modern history (1500-1800) during the course of study/in graduation thesis
- Excellent English language skills (C1) and proficiency in one other modern language (B2)

Desirable:

- Experience in university teaching
- A doctoral project in the area of social and cultural history of the early modern period that can tie in with at least one of the chair's focuses (infos here)

The position is open to all persons, irrespective of gender.

The University would like to increase the proportion of women in areas in which they are underrepresented and thus applications from women are particularly welcome and will be treated with priority if they have the same qualifications and as long as there are no clear reasons which make a fellow applicant more suitable.

Severely disabled applicants with the same qualifications will be considered with preference.
